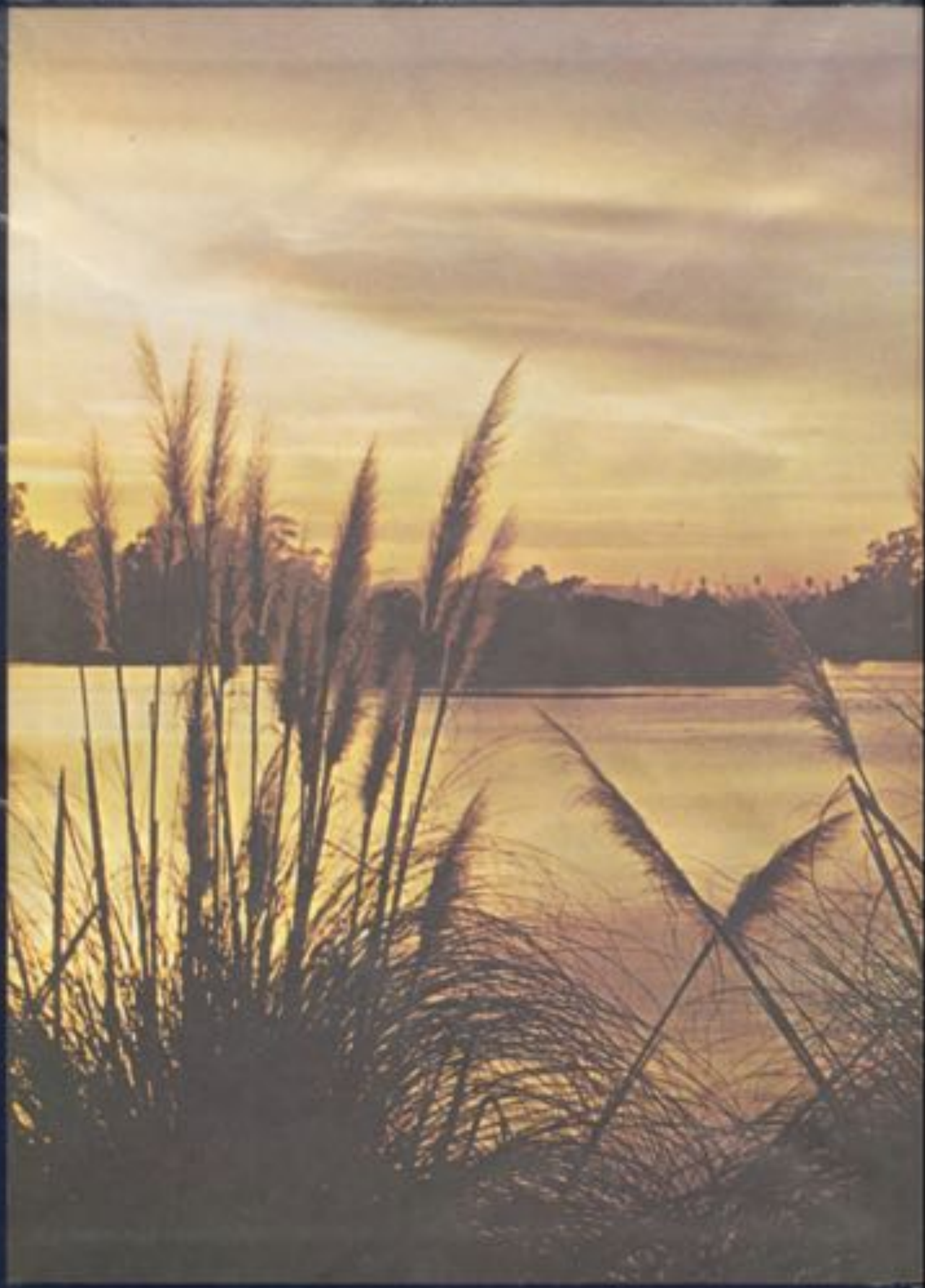
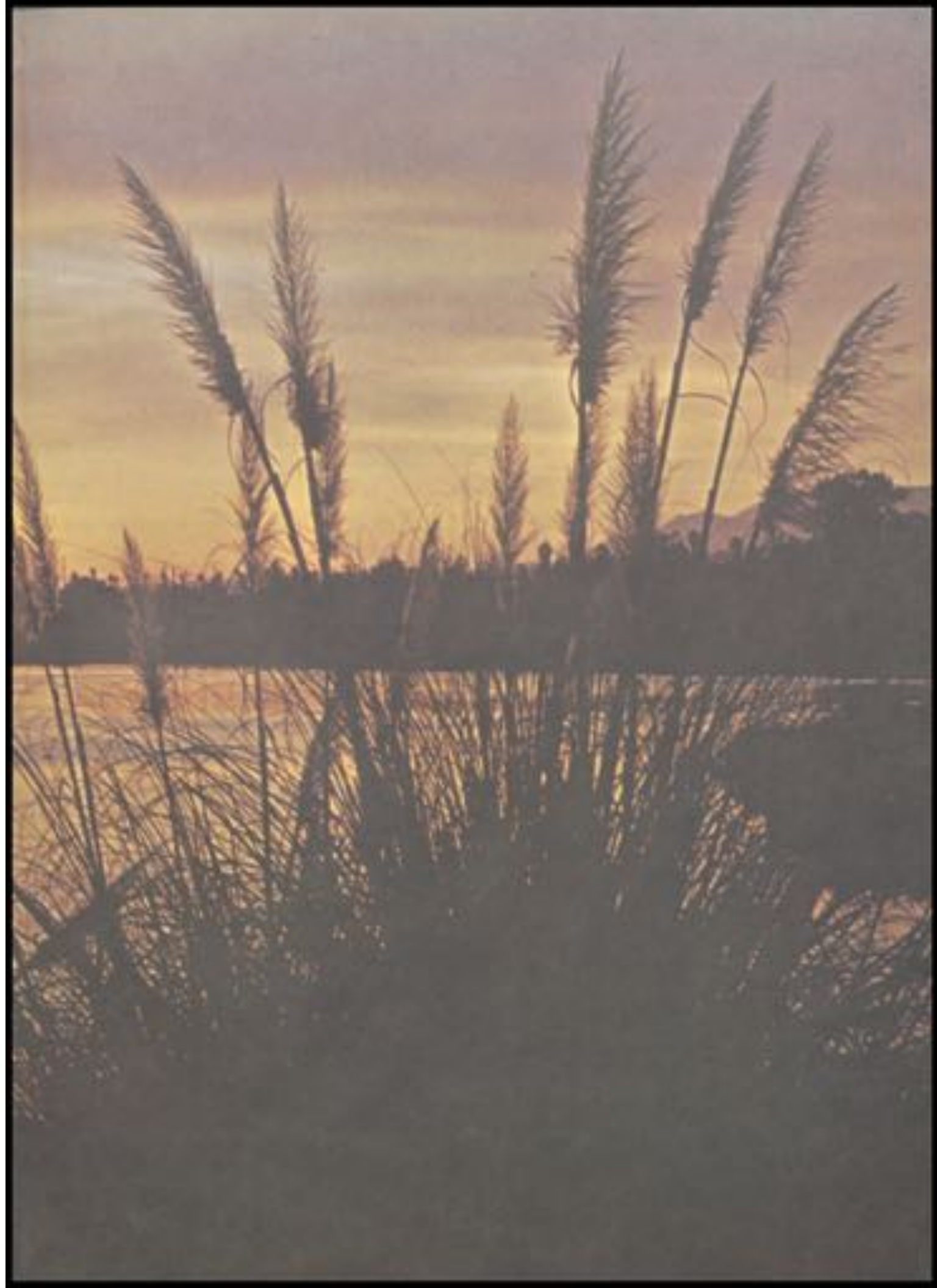
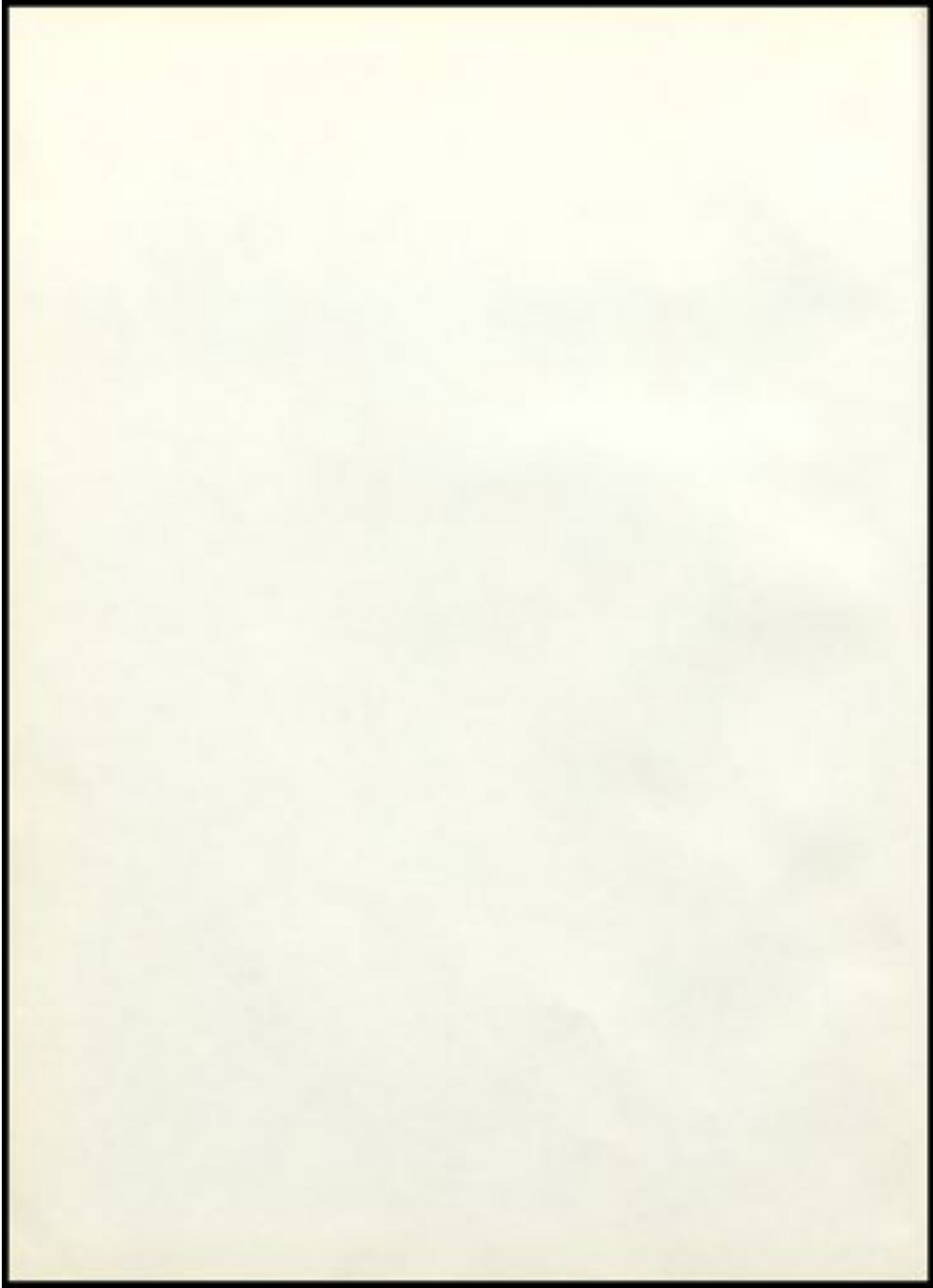

The class of 1968 is privileged to dedicate its yearbook to the new ODEBOLT-ARTHUR school song and to the people who gave it to the school.



Our total membership consists of 69 active, 5 associate, and 11 honorary members. Productive projects provide our members with a learning and an earning experience in agriculture and agricultural occupation employment experience programs. Our members have 100 per cent ownership or are in partnership on productive projects. Productive projects completed: 27 members--144 market litters; 4 members--16 pure-bred litters; 12 members--544 feeder pigs; 20 members--84 beef feeders; 4 members--19 beef cows; 1 member--4 dairy cows; 9 members--93 ewes; 1 member--2 mares; 5 members--61 acres corn; 4 members--60 acres soy beans; and 2 members in AOEE program. Average completion of 1.4 per member; average investment per member in agriculture, \$734.83; and average labor income, \$556.27.

Community service projects include: conducted an agricultural chemical storage survey; cut corn corners at dangerous rural intersections; donated \$25 to Sac City Market Hog Show; conducted seed germination tests of oats and soybeans for farmers; and made flower cans available at the cemetery for Memorial Day. New projects this year are serving coffee after adult education classes, and construction of a trashburner for the City Park. Service to ourselves includes \$1,000 loan fund to finance productive projects, \$100 scholarship to a Senior Vo-Ag student, expenses allowed to conventions and judging contests, and chapter equipment made available for the members' use.

Thirty per cent of our members exhibited livestock at Odebolt Community Fair, Sac County Fair, Ida County Fair, Sac City Market Hog Show, Fort Dodge Market Hog Show, and Iowa State Fair. Our main source of income is the sale of 580 boxes of citrus fruit and the operation of 40 acres of cropland. Total net worth of the chapter on January 31, 1968, is \$7,604.34; total receipts were \$9,917.25; total disbursements amounted to \$9,254.98.

Chuck Lindberg and David Rohlf were our delegates to State FFA convention in Sioux City. Rickie Babcock was in State FFA Chorus, and Myron Siebrecht and Lance Veit played in State FFA Band. We received 15 gold awards in Subdistrict, District, and State contests. A Senior FFA Educational trip was enjoyed by 8 members who visited a cattle ranch in Nebraska and Mumford's feedlots in Greeley, Colorado. Two of our International Harvester dealers received the Iowa Farmer Degree at the annual parent and son banquet at which 230 members, parents, faculty, and school board members were in attendance.

One hundred official FFA calendars were distributed to members and businessmen in the community.

Judging contest results: Silver--State Dairy Contest; 2nd--Graettinger Crop-judging contest; 5th and 7th--Fort Dodge Hog Show; 6th and 12th--Sac City Hog Show; Blue ribbon--Sioux City Invitational with 2nd place team in Sheep and 2nd high individual in Sheep. In State FFA contest: Gold--Program of Work; Gold--Secretary's Book; Gold--Treasurer's Book; Gold--Reporter's Scrapbook; Silver--Chapter Exhibit.

The Odebolt FFA chapter has had a rewarding and prosperous year. Let's not be complacent in our accomplishments but look forward toward the challenges that lie ahead in this dynamic era of changing agriculture.
