












The Multi-Occupations Cooperative Education Program is a State-Approved Vocational Education Program which provides an opportunity for seniors to earn credit toward graduation while receiving practical, on thejob training. In addition to having an academic schedule, the students spend part of the school day at a training station. Students work approximately ten to fifteen hours per week at the job site. They each receive one credit per semester for the Related Class and one credit for the on-the-job training. Students in the program include Dena Bettin; Ida County Courier: Jim Hansen, Meyer, Farms; Jean Hemer, John Murrow C.P.A.; Scott Mandernach, Odebolt Coop Elevator; Ted Rake, Sac County Conservation Board; Shane Reinhart, Miller Printing and Publishing: Bridget Schuldt, Veit's Floral; Mindee Thies, Village Shoe Shoppe; and Shawn Thies, Peavy Grain Company. The students also attend two M.O.C. conferences in Des Moines. An Employer-Employee Breakfast is held at the beginning of the school year to acquaint students and employers with the year's activities. A candy sales campaign is conducted in February and March to help earn money for M.O.C. activities. The final group activity is the Employer-Appreciation Dinner in the spring.







The 1987-88 Odebolt Arthur Trojan Triumph was staffed by the medic lab class. The editors, chosen by the class, were Tammy Hustedt and Greg Mace. 




















































The high school wreetlers profited from many learning experiences in 1987-88. The Trojans were unable to field a full varsity line-up due to bunching of wrestlers at certain weights.
