
Lippincott.



Rebuilding continued in '93-'94 as the Trojan grapplers won three conference meets, including the first triumph over Maple Valley since 1973. Against West Monona, OA notched six consecutive falls and seven total in only eight matches wrestled. The sixth place finish in the conference was the highest since 1991.

Senior captains Mollhoff and Jeff Wulf ended their careers with pins, and Wulf set a school record for most career dual matches wrestled.






